DESIGNED FOR

This programme is designed for Firefighters, Crew Managers, Control and Support Staff who have been identified as having the potential to develop in a Supervisory Management Role in their Fire and Rescue Service. Watch Managers and Control Watch Managers with identified development needs may also attend.

WHO SHOULD ATTEND:

Fire and Rescue Services may send Firefighters, Control Operators, Crew Managers, Control/Watch Managers and Support Staff who have a responsibility for managing safety in their work environment.

AIM

To provide the knowledge, skills and understanding of Health, Safety and Risk Management pertinent to the roles of Crew, Watch, Control Watch Managers and support staff with Managing Safely responsibilities.

LEARNING OUTCOMES

After successful completion of the programme delegates will be able to

- Describe and understand the Health & Safety Management System, HS(G)65 Successful Health & Safety Management and the component parts of a Health & Safety Policy.
- Describe and understand the Health & Safety Loss Management Model by considering losses, accidents, near-misses, immediate and root causes of incidents, active and reactive monitoring and the risk assessment process.
- Describe and understand the legal background to Health, Safety & Risk Management through civil and criminal law.
- Describe, understand and develop an in depth knowledge the process of Risk Assessment and Risk Control and apply this through practical formative assessments.
- Develop knowledge, skills and understanding of reactive and active monitoring and apply this through practical formative assessments.
- Develop knowledge, skills and understanding of the Workplace and Work Equipment Regulations and apply this through practical formative assessments.
- Develop knowledge, skills and understanding of Storage of Resources and Equipment and Handling of Resources Regulations and apply this through practical formative assessments.

- Develop knowledge, skills and understanding of the requirements of Consultation and Liaison Regulations and apply this through practical formative assessments.
