Fire Safety Development Module 2

To enable Fire and Rescue Service personnel who require training to become fire safety advisers, managers and engineers as detailed within the National Occupational Standards for Fire Safety.

DESIGNED FOR

Fire officers who require training in fire safety and who may have responsibility for advising on fire risk assessment in buildings and the enforcement of fire safety legislation.

ENTRY CRITERIA

Delegates require:

- Adequate experience within a fire safety role
- Attended Module 1 or equivalent (Module A)

AIM

To develop, and enhance, the knowledge and skills of personnel in the subject of Fire Safety

To contribute to the process of developing fire safety officers to become effective and proficient fire safety advisers, managers and engineers.

To provide a grounding in the knowledge and skills needed to carry out the task of an inspecting officer.

Module 2 will support the development of those fire safety officers that will have the responsibility of applying their skills in the workplace.

To make fire safety officers aware of the structure and extent of Scottish law and the procedures to be adopted in its application.

To develop the opportunity to practice the concepts of initiating legal proceedings.

The topic areas covered will include:

- Week 1 – Construction – commercial and high risk buildings, offices and shops, premises providing sleeping accommodation

Week 2 – Prosecution procedures, Scottish legal system, court procedures, Healthcare premises and licensed premises.

Week 3 – Residential care premises, HMO's, Historic Scotland/listed buildings and places of assembly.

LEARNING OUTCOMES

After successful completion of the course, the delegates should be able to:

- Describe the generic principles of means of escape and fire safety and have an appreciation of their development.
- Apply the knowledge and principles to means of escape in a flexible, professional but logical manner to provide a safe environment that demonstrates a reasonable standard of safety.
- To offer solutions to fire safety problems with all types of buildings which are founded on good practice.
- Explain the concept of Scottish law.
- Develop an understanding of the role of the Procurator Fiscal.
- Develop an understanding of the procedures to be followed if an offence is considered to have been committed within the fire precautions regulations.
